About us

In 1997 HRIF was founded to help those in need. The focus of HRIF is on helping the most vulnerable people and groups in emergency situations all over the world. HRIF helps by sending aid, including clothing and food. We collect and sort goods in our warehouse in Weesp, the Netherlands. Once the goods are combined, we arrange transport to our local partners on the ground, who then distribute the aid.

We collect donated goods and aid from companies and organizations. Together with our local partners on the ground we assess the needs of the communities we support and distribute the required goods efficiently. Our local partners always have good knowledge of where help is most needed and have the right expertise for the distributions so that they are fair and safe. HRIF is always sensitive to local customs and authorities regarding import rules and regulations. This method of working allows us to offer targeted and rapid large-scale help.

The people who receive our help are vulnerable people including children, women and the elderly in Europe, Asia, Africa and South America. HRIF focuses on shipping clothes, shoes, blankets, food, medical equipment, medicines and (hospital) beds.

When we receive a large donation of toys, we will send it to war zones and refugee camps. At first glance, it may seem that toys aren't a necessity of life but for children it is important to be able to play. By playing, children begin to process the things they experienced, they learn to socialize and to communicate. Every child has the right to play. That is why we believe it so important to send toys to children who don't have any.

The impact of sending and distributing aid in emergency situations and ongoing projects is incredible. Time and again people say that this is a sign of hope in an otherwise hopeless situation.

Both our office and warehouse are in Weesp just outside of Amsterdam. We work here with a small team of employees and volunteers.

MISSION/VISION

MISSION

HRIF collects goods to deliver and distribute to people in need all around the world. For example, we deliver aid to refugees in Iraq, the internally displaced people in Ukraine, The Romani in Romania and the elderly people in Moldova.

VISION

Our vision is to help people worldwide. Especially the most vulnerable groups who live in warzones, refugee camps and are struck by natural disaster.



Dibaga Refugee Camp - Iraq

Dibaga Refugee Camp, located in northern Iraq, is home to thousands of displaced families who fled conflict and instability in search of safety. Established as a temporary shelter, the camp has grown into a vital hub of humanitarian aid, providing food, medical care, and essential supplies to those in need.

Life in Dibaga is marked by resilience. Despite the hardships, families strive to rebuild their lives, with children attending makeshift schools and adults seeking opportunities to support their communities. However, challenges remain, including limited resources, harsh living conditions, and uncertainty about the future.

HRIF is committed to supporting Dibaga by sending **new clothing** to those in need. By ensuring that displaced individuals receive quality, unused garments, we help restore a sense of dignity and comfort in difficult times. Through partnerships and collective efforts, we continue to provide relief and hope to the people in Dibaga.



HRIF's Impact in Ukraine: Bread, Aid & Hope

In November and December, HRIF delivered three truckloads of humanitarian aid to Ukraine, including beds, clothing, hygiene products, and shoes, alongside 25 tons of flour for bakeries and communities in need.

With **21,500 kg** of flour, bakeries in Kharkiv, Dnipro, Mykolaiv, Kropyvnytskyi, and Kryvyi Rih continued to bake thousands of loaves each month, ensuring families in frontline areas have access to fresh bread. An additional 3,500 kg of flour supported communities in Kyiv.

HRIF distributed relief through humanitarian centers in Kyiv, Vinnytsia, Dnipro, Rivne, Cherkasy, and Zhovti Vody, reaching displaced families with much-needed supplies. New beds replaced old ones, though additional slats are still needed.
